back to what they do best... small scale evangelism and discipleship. You will be glad to know that the counselors still gather at the prayer bench during EVERY lesson to lift up their comrade who is teaching the lesson and to pray for the campers. That bench is my favorite spot at camp and is likely the place where many battles in the heavenlies are won!

In closing, we are so grateful to have been able to report to you just a bit of the fruitful ministry we experienced during our two weeks at CBX. It is still a creatively "organic" place to serve... no program-in-a-box happening here! Months of prayerful and thoughtful preparations still go into the camp theme, lessons, songs, atmosphere, activities, trainings... and terrific meals! We found CBX to continue to be doctrinally sound while opening wide their arms to share the truth in love with whomever God brings their way. 


