Sure we send out an email looking for more staff or volunteers to cook or help out, but it's not often we discuss the actual financial and physical needs it takes to keep CBX operating. I was challenged recently by a friend who reminded me to appeal to God for extra grace when we feel weary in His service. Hebrews 4:16 implores us to draw near to the throne of grace so that we may receive mercy and find grace in our time of need.

I think weary is an accurate estimation of what it's like to consistently find the support and resources we need to keep CBX going. As a board member recently observed, "CBX just doesn't make sense when you look at it from a traditional business model standpoint!" His statement wasn't an observation of the state of how



CBX's ministry is operating, but a declaration of God's provision at CBX over the past 40 years. When you look at the cost of reaching socially and economically disadvantaged kids year round through the ministry of CBX, The economics are challenging. Each camper CBX reaches increases the funds we have to secure to keep the doors open. At the same time, there has never been a greater need for the ministry work of CBX with 50% of American youth experiencing divorce in their homes by the time they

When I find myself staring down the bleak outlook of the line items on a profit and loss statement or telling my staff to find creative solutions to economic shortcomings, the peace found at the throne of grace is most needed. I am reminded here that tomorrow looks promising for CBX, not because our staff, board, or efforts are great, but because our Savior is greater than any problem we will ever face or dream up. 2 Corinthians 12:9 reminds us that His grace is sufficient as His power is made perfect in our weakness. for your support. We have taken drastic measures to cut costs over financially. Specifically, with an aging facility, we have several major maintenance needs on the 1-5 year horizon. Eagle and Alpine Lodge are both experiencing log decay and rot. This year we will begin a long term plan of building restoration. Even with us recruiting volunteers to perform the majority of the work in house, the materials needed for restoration are expensive. Additionally, the camp has high priority repairs needed with it's water system storage cistern, camp entrance, and horse facilities. With the challenges to meet our basic budgetary needs every year, funding for the above projects is not available.

RETREAT and FOLLOW-UP - Mary Beth Ward


We just finished a super fun retreat for 8-11 year olds! It was so great hanging out with returning campers, and connecting with kids who are coming to CBX for the first time!
